<p>Course Description: Students will examine psychological principles that can be applied to their personal lives so they can improve relationships, self-image, and attitudes now and in the future. They will examine how to improve communications, different personality types and overcoming worry and fear. Students will explore how habits and motivation can shape the success in their personal life to help them become goal-oriented, positive, successful individuals. Students will examine current critical issues. Emphasis will be placed on developing critical thinking skills, analysis of critical issues and developing possible solutions. Issues that may be investigated on the domestic side include: crime and drugs, health care, environmental concerns, immigration, education and Constitutional rights.
